Early in 2006, the National Science Foundation (NSF) awarded funding for a new and exciting project entitled, the "Geneticist-Educator Network Alliances" (GENA), which actively aims to promote a stronger genetics component among the high school curriculum across public schools within the United States.

Dr. Vieira has recently been chosen to be among the few talented participants to partake in this revolutionary new project, which will take place over a three year period with a network of 92 master Geneticist-Educator Alliances. The GENA Project will involve the meeting of geneticists and teachers to develop and improve the teaching methods of genetics within high schools to develop and implement innovative, new teaching programs in genetics education.

The geneticists and teachers will interact with one another throughout the span of one year, and will also attend an intense preparatory two and a half day workshop. The workshop will run from July 31st to August 2nd, 2007, and most GENA participants will be arriving in Bethesda, Maryland on the afternoon of July 30th. Congratulations, Dr. Vieira!

Dental Registry and DNA Repository News

The Dental Registry and DNA Repository (DRDR) recently reached a pivotal point: the inclusion of its 500th volunteer subject in the registry! With recruitment now occurring in the Implant Center, the Oral Hygiene Clinic, the Emergency Care Clinic, all Module Clinics and Dr. William L. Chung's office in the department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (located at Montefiore Hospital), the DRDR continues to expand with an 85% volunteer acceptance rate—a rate which was initially anticipated to be only around 30%.

Dr. Célia Sasaki-Ferro, one of the Vieira Lab's summer visitors, continues to work very diligently on the project's database. Her goal is to include these first 500 subjects in the database before she departs for Brazil in the fall. Additionally, some very dedicated DRDR summer students are working hard assisting with recruitment efforts as well as becoming acclimated to performing DNA extractions. These students recently attended the DRDR's "Data and Safety Monitoring

Plan," a mandatory meeting where an ongoing plan was set forth to maintain continued quality assurance of the project.
