#### **Lab News**

On the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Liberation of Auschwitz, we remember Ms. Edith Bell, who recently passed away. She came to speak to Dr. Vieira's Craniofacial Genetics course on the topic of ethics in 2011. A Holocaust survivor, Ms. Bell recounted her story of being separated from her family, sent to various work camps, and ultimately becoming free with the arrival of the Russians in 1945. Ultimately losing her father to starvation and her mother to the gas chamber, Ms. Bell recalled being transported several times before ending up in Wohlan, Germany. A large part of Ms. Bell's message was drawing parallels between Nazi Germany and the political climate in the United States today. Ms. Bell was a member of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, which has opposed wars all the way back to World War I. She also served on the board of the Thomas Merton Center in Pittsburgh, working to promote peace and social justice, and was an active member of the Raging Grannies of Pittsburgh, a group which uses satirical song to spread the message of peace, justice, and equality.
