

## Financial Aid Checklist for Residents and Oral Biology Graduates 2020-2021

- File your FAFSA*** -We highly recommend that you use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to complete the income section of the form. Using this tool will assure the transfer of the proper financial information. Parental information is not required as graduate students are considered to be independent. **You must include the following School Codes on your FAFSA: 008815, University of Pittsburgh and E00750, Pitt Dental.** Deadline for filing the FAFSA is **April 30, 2020**. Any FAFSA filed after the deadline may delay your financial aid. The student will be responsible for any late fees incurred on their student account in this situation.
  
- Complete the Pitt Dental Financial Aid Application OR Pitt Dental Application Update and return it by the deadline*** – First time applicants must complete the Financial Aid Application. Applicants renewing their financial aid can complete the Application Update. Be sure to follow the instructions carefully.

You may receive emails or a financial aid application from the University of Pittsburgh Financial Aid Office on lower campus. Please note that this application can be discarded. The Pitt Dental financial aid application is the **ONLY** University financial aid application that you will need to complete.

- Complete your Entrance Counseling*** – **FOR ALL FIRST-TIME Pitt Dental BORROWERS**, you must complete online Entrance Counseling for Stafford/Graduate PLUS loans even if you have completed this process at another school.
  
- Complete your Master Promissory Note (MPN)*** – **FOR ALL FIRST-TIME LOAN BORROWERS**, you must complete the MPN online for Unsubsidized Direct Stafford and Graduate PLUS loans (if participating in this program).
  
- Sign your Financial Aid Award Letter*** –Award letters will be sent electronically beginning in May.

**It is very important that you follow this checklist and meet the deadlines. Failure to do so may result in late disbursement of your financial aid, late fees for tuition charges, and financial holds on your student account.
